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Admission's requirements and duration	
Title required for access	Three-year degree diploma, three-year university degree, degree diploma of the old system (four-year degree) or any other qualification obtained abroad and recognized as suitable by current legislation constitute a qualification for admission to the degree course.
Access mode	Free after checking the curricular requirements and the preparation of a student.
Assessment of curricular requirements and of adequacy of personal preparation	<p>Enrollment in the Master's Degree is subject to verification of both the possession of curricular requirements and of adequacy of personal preparation.</p> <p>To successfully attend the Master's Degree course, it is necessary to have acquired adequate knowledge of the disciplines of business, economics, business and mathematical-statistics as well as to have acquired knowledge of the English language (level B2).</p> <p>To access the master's degree program, the following curricular requirements are also required:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (1) four-year degree from the previous system (Degree in Political Economy, Economics and Commerce, Business Administration and equivalent), degree in classes (ex 509) 17 (economics and business management) and 28 (economics) and in the classes (formerly 270) L-18 (economics and business management) and L-33 (economics), or with equivalent foreign qualification (2) If the student does not come from the aforementioned classes, the student must have acquired an adequate number of educational credits in sets of scientific-disciplinary sectors, in the economic-business and mathematical-statistical areas. These skills must be certified by the previous career and recognizable in at least 50 training credits, of which at least 30 in the economic field (SSD: M-GRR / 02 Economic-political geography; SECS- P / 01 Political economy; SECS-P / 02 Political economy ; SECS-P / 03 Finance sciences; SECS-P / 04 History of economic thought; SECS-P / 05 Econometrics; SECS-P / 06 Applied economics; SECS-P / 12 Economic history), 10 in the economic-business field (SSD: SECS-P / 07 Business

	<p>Administration; SECS-P / 08 Business Economics and Management; SECS-P / 09 Corporate Finance; SECS-P / 10 Business Organization; SECS-P / 11 Economics of Financial Intermediaries) and 10 in the statistical-mathematical field (MAT / 01 Mathematical logic; MAT / 02 Algebra; MAT / 03 Geometry; MAT / 05 Mathematical analysis; INF / 01 Computer science; MAT / 06 Probability and mathematical statistics; SECS-S / 01 Statistics; SECS-S / 03 - Economic Statistics; SECS-S / 04 Demography; SECS-S / 05 Social Statistics; SECS-S / 06 Mathematical Methods of Economics and Actual Sciences (rials and financials).</p> <p>The previous career of the student referred to in point 2 will be examined by the Didactic Commission, delegated by the Council of the didactic structure to exercise this function. The teaching commission may carry out a preliminary interview that proves the possession of adequate knowledge and skills, if it is deemed necessary.</p> <p>The verification of personal preparation, for graduates in the degree classes referred to in point 1, will instead be based on the degree mark previously obtained. The personal preparation of graduates in the degree classes referred to in point 1 who have obtained a degree mark equal to or greater than 70/110 will be considered verified.</p> <p>Graduates in the classes referred to in point 1 who do not meet the requisite on the degree mark and graduates from other courses of studies – not listed above –, referred to in point 2, will be examined by the competent didactic structure which will be able to carry out a preliminary interview to prove possession of the knowledge and skills necessary for access</p> <p>Further requirements relating to the personal preparation of the student can be consulted on the page: link: http://www.unife.it/igianato/lm.economics/future-student/admission-requirements</p>

State exam	<p>The attainment of the degree in Master's degree in Economics, Management and Policies for Global Challenges (class LM-56) allows access to the State Exam to obtain the qualification to practice as a Chartered Accountant, after completing of a period of apprenticeship.</p> <p>Passing the State Exam also allows enrollment in the Register of Chartered Accountants and Accounting Experts, in Section A "Accountants".</p> <p>In compliance with the framework agreement signed between MIUR and the CNDCEC in October 2014, the Order of Chartered Accountants and Accounting Experts of Ferrara and the University of Ferrara signed a special agreement aimed at establishing the conditions for the " facilitated access to the state exam. Duration different from normal	<p>Part time registration is possible for those who work, but also for those who find themselves in other particular situations for which this is useful.</p> <p>It is also possible to graduate in fewer years than the normal duration of the course (but in any case equal to at least two years) by anticipating any internships and training stages or by submitting your proposal to the Council of the teaching structure. Safety training in the workplace pursuant to Legislative Decree 81/2008 and subsequent amendments	<p>To acquire eligibility for safety training in the workplace, it is necessary to participate in an e-learning course on the Unifesicura educational platform.</p> <p>The instructions and methods of access are available at the following link: http://www.unife.it/it/x-te/diritti/sicurezza</p> <p>The tests for obtaining the certificates are an integral part of the e-learning course and are available at the end of the relative courses: Basic Training and Specific Training.</p> <p>You will be able to access the platform at any time of the academic year, and participate in the tests without having to register for exams.</p> <p>The records of eligibility in the booklets will take place on a monthly basis.</p> <p>Eligibility does not allow for the accrual of CFUs and there is no vote.</p> <p>Training on safety in the workplace constitutes a permanent credit and is equivalent to 8 hours of worker training (low risk), in compliance with the provisions of art. 37 of Legislative Decree 81/2008 and the subsequent State Regions Agreements of 21/12/2011 and 07/07/2016, relating to training standards on safety in the workplace .</p> <p>Students in possession of certificates relating to courses in the field of Training and Safety in the workplace who wish to request recognition for the purpose of the related exam, must consult the section of the portal "Unife per te", section "health, rights and safety" , under "workplace safety training": http://www.unife.it/it/x-te/diritti/sicurezza</p> <p>Only certificates attesting 16 hours of training (high risk), or Form A and Form B Training for ASPP / RSPP will be accepted.
