ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS				
Title required for access	Three-year bachelor degree, related to subjects coherent with LM-56 study plan or any other study degree obtained abroad and recognized as suitable by the current legislation.			
Access modality	Free.			
Assessment of curricular requirements and of adequacy of the personal preparation	Enrolment in the Master's Degree depends upon the verification of both the possession of the curricular requirements and of the adequacy of the personal preparation, according to art. 6, comma 2 of DM 270/04. Enrollment criteria and requirements are defined by the Study Course Committee and published at the following webpage: http://www.unife.it/economia/lm.economics/future-student/admission-requirements To access the Master's programme, a three-year bachelor degree, related to subjects coherent with LM-56 study plan or any other study degree obtained abroad and recognized as suitable by the current legislation is required. In particular: - if the title is acquired in Italy (by Italian citizens, EU and extra-EU citizens living in Italy) it is sufficient to hold a bachelor degree in: - Scienza dell'economia e della gestione aziendale (L-18) (Economics and business management science); - Scienze economiche (L-33) (Economics) or a bachelor degree in Scienze dell'economia e della gestione aziendale 17 (economics and business management), Scienze economiche 28 (economics) or a			

4-year degree in classes (ex 509) and 28 (Laurea in economia Politica, Economia e Commercio, Economia aziendale).

Other first-level bachelor degrees can be considered valid provided that the student has acquired at least 50 educational credits in specific scientific-disciplinary sectors. In particular:

- at least 30 credits in economics (SSD: M-GRR / 02 Economic-political geography; SECS-P / 01 Political economy; SECS-P / 02 Political economy; SECS-P / 03 Finance sciences; SECS-P / 04 History of economic thought; SECS-P / 05 Econometrics; SECS-P / 06 Applied economics; SECS-P / 12 Economic history);
- at least 10 credits in business (SSD: SECS-P / 07 Business Administration; SECS-P / 08 Business Economics and Management; SECS-P / 09 Corporate Finance; SECS-P / 10 Business Organization; SECS-P / 11 Economics of Financial Intermediaries);
- at least 10 credits in statistics/mathematics (MAT / 01 Mathematical logics; MAT / 02 Algebra; MAT / 03 Geometry; MAT / 05 Mathematical analysis; INF / 01 Computer science; MAT / 06 Probability and mathematical statistics; SECS-S / 01 Statistics; SECS-S / 03 Economic Statistics; SECS-S / 04 Demography; SECS-S / 05 Social Statistics; SECS-S / 06 Mathematical Methods of Economics and Actuarial and financial Sciences).

- If you wish to enroll with a bachelor degree non obtained in Italy, and not referring to ECTS system grade, your request will be evaluated by a Teaching Committee. Evaluation is done during the enrollment procedure studying the previous career of the student, not entrance examination will be done.

To be eligible for enrolment, students must hold at least a B2 level of English. If you have not done a bachelor degree taught in English and you haven't got an international certification you will have to sustain an interview.

The personal preparation will be evaluated by the Teaching Commission, according to the modalities that are defined by the Study Course Committee.

Normal Duration of the programme	The normal duration of the programme is of 2 years.
Duration different from the normal one	Part time registration is possible for those who work, but also for those who find themselves in other particular situations for which this is useful. It is also possible to graduate in fewer years than the normal duration of the course (but in any case equal to at least two years) by submitting your proposal to the Council of the teaching structure. The Council will decide on this by approving the proposal or agreeing any changes with the student. If the student chooses the curriculum with a longer than normal duration, and, in the

Prerequisites	The degree course has not exams that are propaedeutic for other exams
Barriers	The degree course has no exams that are barriers for other exams.
Student status loss / obsolescence	Students lose their status if they do not pass any exam for eight consecutive years. This does not hold for students who only lack the final test (art. 28 of student regulation). The study course does not foresee obsolescence of contents.
Internship	Traineeships can take place both within the University or in other institutions/organizations. In both cases, the traineeship has to be coherent with the Study Course content and teaching objectives. Project work	Among the elective course is possible to choose the project work. The project work is an internship experience during which the student, together with the professor who supervise him, carry out an innovation process in the company. The student is supposed to have a much more active approach than during the simple internship. The student need to figure out in advance the problem he/she want to solve and agree with the professor the object of the work.
