This workshop gives a cross-reading of history and architecture of the Renaissance period and it provides an overview of the 'new renaissance' of the Italian product and interior design, during the Twentieth century.

The workshop, of 48 hours, has been shared in two modules:

- *History and architecture of the Italian Renaissance: XIV-XVI centuries* (24 hours: Feb 18th/21st)
- *The new renaissance of the Italian product & interior design: the XX century* (24 hours: Feb 20th/22nd)

REGULATION

This workshop will be provided through the Department of Architecture, with the support of the Department of Humanities, for a **maximum of 40 students** enrolled in any kind of School of the University of Ferrara (both Italian and International students). In case of enrolment requests in excess of capacity, International students will take priority. Knowledge of **English** at B1 level or equivalent is required (self-certification is accepted from students coming from English speaking Countries).

Minimum attendance is 80% of course (thus 39 hours out of 48), including any potential exam conflicts during the workshop period. Compulsory classroom interviews, exercises and a **final test** are foreseen.
