## Forager Use of "Persistent Places" During the Epigravettian in the Circum-Adriatic Regions

The Epigravettian represents one of the final Upper Palaeolithic cultural phases in Europe, emerging across a wide area around 26,000 to 24,000 years ago and persisting until the Pleistocene-Holocene transition. While its onset appears relatively synchronous across regions, its end varies in timing and form. In the circum-Adriatic zone, this period coincided with dramatic environmental transformations—including the expansion and later retreat of glaciers, sea-level changes that opened and then submerged the Great Adriatic Plain, and widespread reforestation during the Bølling-Allerød warming. These climatic shifts significantly impacted human lifeways, influencing territorial strategies, seasonal movements, and patterns of social interaction.

This Symposium focuses on the emergence of "persistent places" during the Epigravettian—landscape locales repeatedly occupied over long durations, likely serving as aggregation hubs for mobile groups. These sites signal a shift from earlier, highly mobile subsistence strategies toward more stable residential mobility. Despite changing ecologies, Epigravettian huntergatherers maintained extensive social networks across the circum-Adriatic and neighboring regions, sharing tool types, symbolic behaviors, and cultural traditions.
