Emphasising an integrated, interdisciplinary perspective, the event explores how these systems interact and affect different social groups, particularly those marginalised by gender, ethnicity or religion. Environmental accounting serves as a key framework for evaluating environmental impacts, resource efficiency and their social and distributive consequences.
