Are students required to register for courses before their arrival or upon arrival?	Students register for the courses after their arrival in Strasbourg.
Language of teaching	As most of the lectures are held in French it is necessary that the students have good knowledge of French (minimum B1 level). However no certificate is required. 3 courses are available in English language (2 on winter semester and 1 on spring semester).

Services available for exchange students	Information packages The international Office sends all future exchange students two information packages by email:
	The <u>first information package</u> is sent when the nominations have arrived at the International Relations Office. It includes general information about Strasbourg and the Faculty of Law, admission procedure as well as information about accommodation.
	The <u>second information package</u> is sent approximately at the end of July. More detailed information about their arrival in Strasbourg and other cultural leisure activities are provided in this package.
	We recommend your outgoing students to register the email <u>droit-erasmus@unistra.fr</u> in their contact list. They also have to check frequently their spam/junk box.

	French as Foreign Language French Language Courses for foreign students will be held during both semesters.
Is the transcript of records being sent to the student or the home university?	The transcript of records will be sent to the Home University (by email and regular mail) and to the student (by email only)
Application deadlines:	Incoming students: Online application before May 15, for the first semester or the whole year before October 30, for the second semester Application form receipt before June 1, for the first semester or the all year before November 15, for the second semester
	Outgoing students from the Faculty of Law of the University of Strasbourg will be nominated before the end of march or at the beginning of April according to our partner's application deadline

Accommodation information	It may be possible for exchange students to have a room at the university campus but they have to apply within the deadline and arrive on the date they have indicated. However, note that the university does not guarantee housing at the campus. Attention please, rooms are allocated, as a priority, to the exchange students nominated for the full year.
What is the cost of accommodation in the student residences?	Between 165 and 230 €/month. It depends of the room (with or without private bathroom and toilets). About 450 €/month for a studio apartment.

Average living costs per month (food, housing)	Approx. 800 eur (incl. housing) There are no tuition or administrative fees for exchange students except for sports practice (15 €).
Are exchange students required to obtain medical insurance?	All students have to present a valid health insurance when enrolling. Students coming from other member states of European Union will bring their European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) with them.
