	Students need to get their European Health Insurance card before coming for their mobility. It has to be valid for the entire mobility period. <u>N.B</u> : For non European students, if you do not have access to the European card, you will have to proceed as international students unless you are more than 28 years old and/or have private social security insurance.	Joining the social security coverage is mandatory for all students under 28 (except European or Canadian students). This coverage is valid for the academic year. Students have to pay the insurance fee (approx. 213€) when collecting their student card. They will have to choose between two health insurance payment centers. Overview of the cost of living in Paris per month (€)	Rent (€): around 750 €/month for a room (in Paris) Transport fares (€): around 65 €/month for Paris (Zone 1-2) N.B. a student discount pass can be purchased ("Imagin'R"). For more information, please check the website: http://www.imagine-r.com/ Food (€): 250 €/month Cinema tickets (€): around 10 € (possibility of student discounts)
	Note that it is very difficult for exchange students to get a part-time job. So it is important that students have enough funding to cover the expected cost of their stay at Paris, which should be at least 600/800 Euros (or equivalent in the student's currency) per month for the expected period of stay.
