Online application form must be filled in after you have been selected by your home university for study abroad at the University of Tartu.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE:

Required documents for Erasmus programme exchange students are:

1. **online application form** – fill out, submit it and print it out. It has to be signed by home institution's coordinator and a student! Home university application form is not suitable! Application deadline: June 1, 2014 for EU students, Mai 1, 2014 for non-EU students.

2. **transcript of university records** (must bear an original seal and signature of an authorized official, in English)

3. copy of valid identification document (non-EU applicants – valid passport copy)

4. one photo (3 cm x 4 cm; attach to the application form)

5. proof of English language skills (not applicable for native speakers and students of the universities where English is the language of instruction). English language requirements – see more in our website: <u>http://www.ut.ee/en/studies/exchange-and-visiting-students/exchange-students</u> (Self Assessment Grid). PS! The proof of language must clearly state your level corresponds at least B2 according to CEFR.

Learning Agreement (only if required by your home university).

When it is required by your home university to sign the Learning Agreement before the exchange period starts, it must be submitted with other application documents by the application deadline. In that case, the Learning Agreement will be sent back to you after you have been admitted officially. Please note that the Learning Agreements, which will be submitted later, will be given back only at the beginning of the semester in Tartu.

English taught courses are available on our website: <u>http://www.ut.ee/en/courses-taught-english</u>. The list of English taught courses for the autumn semester will be available by the end of March 2014. **Keep in mind!** Short-term international students need to take at least **15 ECTS per semester** at the University of Tartu. Your home institution might also have certain requirements as to courses you need to take or amount of credits you need to obtain! You are free to select courses from different programmes and faculties in order to compile a study plan that best suits your needs. Changes can be made to the originally proposed study plan by filling in the form for the changes to original Learning Agreement.

ADMISSION TO THE UNIVERSITY OF TARTU

After all applications have arrived we will start to process them. After careful evaluation, the faculties at the University of Tartu inform the International Student Service of their decision (within 3–4 weeks after receiving the documents) and in case of an acceptance, you will be notified via online system first. Student will be provided automatically with usernames and passwords after filling in the application, so that they can monitor their admission process online.

ACCOMMODATION

Student has to apply for accommodation in order to guarantee a place in the dormitory! Dormitory is open for 24 hours to pick up your room key. The monthly rate for a place in a double room is approximately 115 EUR. Deposit is 80 EUR per place (will be refunded to students unless there are some property damage caused and the deposit money is used to cover the cost of repair). Please have the deposit in cash to get a key to your room when arriving.

RESIDENCE PERMITS AND RIGHT OF RESIDENCE

EU citizens (including EEA and Swiss Federation) – in order to obtain the right of temporary residence in Estonia, EU citizens must register themselves as citizens of Tartu within three months from the date of entering Estonia. That can be done in the Population Register Office in Tartu.
