











- ▶ It is clear now that what Huges saw was a portion of the so-called Great theatre at Kassope (Riginos, Papakosta 2017).










Bouleuterion of Miletus (I.I. Tolstogo. M.—L., 1948, s. 149)





# Polis, Ethnos, Koinon



«[...] and the Hellenic troops as they advanced maintained their ranks and were on their guard until they encamped in a suitable place; but the **Chaonians**, who were not only confident of themselves but were also recognised as very excellent fighting men by the inhabitants of that part of the mainland, did not halt to make camp, but advanced with a rush along with the other **barbarians**, thinking that they could take the town at the first assault, and thus gain the glory for themselves.»

# The oracular enquiry from Dodona

- ▶ What is the meaning of the word *polis* here?
- It stands for the *koinon* (administrative)
- It refers to the urban settlement closer to a city (urbanistic)
- ▶ What does this say about the identity concept of the Chaonians and/or the inhabitants of *Phoinike*?












# Epirus and Southern Illyria as an Hellenistic Kingdom

- ▶ The birth of a Kingdom is the driving force for the spread of a peculiar and identitarian architectonic and urbanistic style
- ▶ The result of this style is due from the interactions between the different Mediterranean actors during the Hellenistic era
- ▶ The relationship between Greece, specifically the Peloponnesian network, and Epirus and Southern Illyria remains strong
- ▶ The Adriatic-Ionic network plays its role too in the definition of an Hellenistic urbanistic-architectural syntax










Plans of the first and second phase of the theatre (E. Rinaldi; from Villicich 2018, Fig. 58 and 85)














Plan of the city and the theatre by University of Macerata


